4. Have procedures and processes in place to **be held accountable** for the resources of the nation and to act fairly and ethically, with zero tolerance for wastage and squander;



5. **Serve all South Africans fairly** irrespective of their race, class or whichever political party they may have voted for;
6. Accept the election results and **work in harmony with other political parties** after the elections irrespective of whether they win or lose **and** ensure that good governance, service delivery and development is unhindered and done better; and
7. Conduct Foreign Relations that are in the best interest of the country and that **promotes global fair trade, cultural exchanges, peace, justice and solidarity** amongst all nations.

The 2024 Elections is a great opportunity for Voters to select **honourable, selfless and competent** leaders.
